Joseph immediately recognized the gravity of the call. With calm professionalism and heartfelt empathy, he engaged the individual in conversation, built trust and kept them talking—all while working swiftly behind the scenes to identify their location. Joseph collaborated closely with nursing

leadership and law-enforcement agencies, ultimately securing the information needed to dispatch help.

Thanks to his quick thinking, steady demeanor and expert coordination, law enforcement was able to intervene and safely transport the patient to the emergency department for immediate care.

This potentially tragic situation ended in hope because of Joseph's decisive actions and unwavering commitment to patient safety. His compassion, vigilance and dedication are truly commendable.
